ACCREDITATION COMMISSION ACTION

Public Disclosure Statement Regarding the Change of Status for BOSTON BAPTIST COLLEGE Boston, Massachusetts From ACCREDITED to ACCREDITED – ON PROBATION Issued by the Accreditation Commission on April 24, 2018

Boston Baptist College: The following information is provided by the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (TRACS) regarding the current status of Boston Baptist College (BBC). Information presented is made available in accordance with TRACS policy. Neither the Commission nor the staff of TRACS will make further comment regarding this institution.

What action has the Accreditation Commission taken with regard to Boston Baptist College?

On April 24, 2018, the Accreditation Commission voted to continue BBC on *Probation*. BBC will have six months to come into compliance with the Standards noted below with a *Progress Report* due August 15, 2018. The Commission action became final upon the expiration of the Appeal period, on May 29, 2018.

What is the accreditation status of Boston Baptist College? The institution will maintain the current *Accredited – On Probation* status until the October 2018 meeting of the Accreditation Commission.

What will happen at the next meeting? At the next meeting, the Accreditation Commission has the following options:

If the institution corrects its deficiencies and demonstrates compliance with the Accreditation Standards noted below, the Accreditation Commission shall remove all adverse action against the institution.

If the institution has not corrected its deficiencies and demonstrated compliance with the Accreditation Standards noted below within the period allowed, the Accreditation Commission can:

- i. Require the institution to Show Cause why its accreditation should not be terminated.

Why was the accreditation of Boston Baptist College originally changed to Accredited - on Probation? This action of the Accreditation Commission was based on the determination that the institution's non-compliance with the Accreditation Standards is substantively significant and rises to the level where the institution's ability to fulfill its mission or to provide a quality educational experience consistent with that associated with an accredited post-secondary institution is in question. In summary, the Commission found that BBC was not in compliance with Standards 17.1, and 17.5. (Financial Stability).
