From CANDIDATE – ON SHOW CAUSE to TERMINATED

Issued by the Accreditation Commission on November 24, 2020

Yuin University, 2007 E. Compton Blvd., Compton, California 90221:

The following information is provided by the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (TRACS) regarding the current status of Yuin University (YU). Information presented is made available in accordance with TRACS policy. Neither the TRACS Accreditation Commission nor the staff of TRACS will make further comment regarding this institution.

What action has the TRACS Accreditation Commission taken regarding Yuin University?

On May 21, 2020, the Accreditation Commission voted to Terminate YU as a Candidate for Accreditation. YU was allowed a time period specified by policy to appeal the decision of the Accreditation Commission. YU appealed the decision to Terminate its Candidacy and, due to the COVID-19 Pandemic disruption, requested an extension of time to prepare its appeal response to the Appeal Committee. The TRACS President granted the extension. After reviewing the materials related to the termination action and the YU response to the action, the TRACS Appeal Committee met with both YU and TRACS staff on November 20, 2020.

The Appeal Committee reached a decision on November 20, 2020, that upheld the termination of the accreditation of YU by the TRACS Accreditation Commission.

The effective date of the termination of the accreditation of Yuin University is December 31, 2020.

Why was the accreditation status of Yuin University changed from Candidate - on Show Cause to TERMINATED?

This action of the Accreditation Commission was based on the determination that the institution's non-compliance with the Accreditation Standards is substantively significant and rises to the level where the institution's ability to fulfill its mission or to provide a quality educational experience consistent with that associated with a pre-accredited post-secondary institution is in question. In summary, the Commission found that YU could not demonstrate compliance with Standards 4.1, 11.1, 11.2, 11.3, 11.6 and 11.7.
